1. there is no FN member that is currently relying on water from American Gulch
2. that adequate flow in Bonanza Creek is a GENERAL concern, and the YWB must be sure that water resources are available for other miners and users in the area...
3. Concerning American Gulch, TH needs assurances that when the mining project is finished, the stream will have been re-habilitated as closely as possible to its natural, pre-existing state.

Good morning Bill,

As a point of clarification of your intervention to the above application. You state that water use decisions for water adjacent and within R-20A must not negatively affect any particular user within R-20A.

As this application proposes to take 100% of the water from American Gulch by use of a cross-valley dam and may use a portion (18% of the flow) of the water within Bonanza creek if required and not return the flow as it will be seepage to ground and evaporative loss due to recycling, could you clarify if this use will negatively impact a First Nation member or the First nation in this Settlement Parcel or downstream of the application area.
